

Charitable Gaming Rules for KECC

What you cannot do!!!!

- ❖ You cannot conduct any game of chance except a raffle.
 - A game of chance is defined as “staking or risking something of value on the outcome of a contest game, gaming scheme, or gaming device which: (a) Is based upon an element of chance, in accord with an agreement or understanding that someone will receive something of value if there is a certain outcome; and (b) does not include a contest or game in which eligibility to participate is determined by chance and the ultimate winner is determined by skill.” 820 KAR 1:001 Section I (32).

- ❖ Therefore, you cannot conduct:
 - Cakewalk;
 - A wheel game;
 - Bingo;
 - Poker tournament;
 - Golf ball drop; or
 - NCAA bracket.

What you can do!!!!

- ❖ You may conduct a Raffle provided:
 - An organization or group of individuals does not conduct a raffle more than 3 times per calendar year;
 - Gross receipts from the Raffle do not exceed \$150 dollars;
 - And all proceeds from each raffle must be donated to a charitable organization (KECC).
 - You must sell all tickets for the same price. **Discounting the price is not allowed.**

- ❖ You can sell anything (bake sales, doughnuts, ice cream, etc.)
- ❖ You can have auctions (live or silent).
- ❖ You can have games of skill.
 - Basketball shooting;
 - Bean Bag Toss;
 - Corn Hole Tournament;
 - Milk Bottle Throw
 - Golf Putting; or
 - Guessing Jellybeans in a Jar.
